Benner Township Supervisors May 1, 2000

The regularly scheduled meeting of the Benner Township Board of Supervisors was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by the Chairman, Michael Kelleher with members Richard Lahr and Dave Breon present. Also in attendance were Fred Wilder, Clair Stem, Denise Jenkins, Sue Tressler, Valerie Dench and Renee McGowan.

PERSONS TO ADDRESS THE BOARD

<u>Denise Jenkins</u>: Ms. Jenkins expressed her concerns to the Board regarding the septic system malfunction at the John & Elizabeth Tucker residence. Ms. Jenkins noted that on almost a daily basis raw sewage in flowing to the top of the ground and across the road into her yard. She noted that she feels this problem has been going on entirely too long and wants something done about it. Much discussion was held. Ms. McGowan noted that a citation was filed with the District Magistrate's office on April 28th but that a hearing has not yet been scheduled.

<u>Valerie Dench & Fred Wilder:</u> Ms. Dench was present to ask the Board if they would consider a zoning ordinance amendment to include "Commercial Recreation Uses" in the Campus Industrial District. She noted that she would like to construct a 22,000 to 23,000 sq. ft. building that would house an indoor roller rink, video games and a snack bar. She noted that she is also considering constructing an outside inline hockey rink. Ms. Dench noted that if everything goes right her projected opening date would be March 1, 2001.

The Board asked that this request be passed on to the Planning Commission for their review and comments.

*Computer Program: The County is developing an addressing computer program that they are willing to give to the Township for their use. The County's programmer is going to see if he can combine Renee's Zoning Data Base system with their program.

*Magistrate Notice: Ms. McGowan again noted that the Tucker complaint has been filed and we are waiting for a hearing date to be scheduled. The Board noted that they want a plan of action ready to implement prior to the hearing date.
