Stormwater Management Plan for the Spring Creek Watershed: It was noted that the Board is in receipt of the Stormwater Management Plan for the Spring Creek Watershed that has been prepared by the Spring Creek Watershed Commission. Mr. Weikel has reviewed this plan and has provided comments to it. The County is asking that the Board write a letter showing support of the Stormwater Plan. Mr. Breon moved to create and send a letter of support to the Commissioners for the Spring Creek Watershed Stormwater Management Plan. Mr. Lahr seconded the motion.
