Purdue Mt. Road - discussion was held concerning the different methods of stabilizing the roadway and the costs associated with each.

ROAD SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The new backhoe has been delivered.

Door for the Buffalo Run park building. Discussion was held about 16 gauge steel door. Mr. Breon noted that he feels that something heavier than 16 gauge needs to be installed. Mr. O'Leary noted that he would check to see what other options are out there.

It was noted that mulch is needed for the parks. Mr. O'Leary noted that the certified mulch is more expensive than the triple ground but seems to be the same product. The Board noted that for insurance purposes that certified mulch should be purchased.

The outfield fencing for the Buffalo Run Community Park was ordered and has been received.

Paving projects were gone over. Mr. O'Leary noted that he plans to have Penn Dot to finish up the bid documents and get the projects advertised. Areas include to be paved are Purdue Mt., Raymond's Lane and Upper Gyp Road.

Munici-Bid: Mr. O'Leary noted that Munici-bid is a program that costs \$200 a year to join and allows for unlimited advertising to sell off surplus items. This program is another option for municipalities to use instead of adverting in the local newspaper.

Part-Time Seasonal Position: Mr. Elnitski moved to offer the part-time seasonal position to Steve Zelznick. Mr. Breon seconded the motion.

Spring Creek Canyon Property: Mr. Breon noted that we received a digital version on Friday from the consultant Environmental Planning and Design. DCNR had to review the changes and approve them prior to making the document available to the public. Mr. Breon noted that late this afternoon we received DCNR's approval so the study will be on the Township's website later this evening. DCNR has received recommendation letters from Penn State and ClearWater Conservancy on the study. Changes to the plan from the last version include: No active recreation at all will be shown on land that was studied. Bike trails will need future studies to see if it is compatible. No locations will be shown to put boats in or to have them taken out as further studies will need to be completed to see if this use is compatible with the area. Mr. Elnitski moved to adopt Resolution 09-2 which accepts the plan as amended by Environmental Planning and Design. Mr. Breon seconded the motion.

<u>Garbage Collection:</u> It was noted that the Board needs to decide whether or not they wish to add an administrative fee to pay for someone part-time to assist in answering phone calls etc. for the first six months. Mrs. Royer noted that since the newsletter has gone out only two phone calls have been received with people being against it. Mr. Elnitski moved to waive the collection of the administrative fee. Mr. Breon seconded the motion.
