Refuse and Recycling Begins in January

Over the past several months your elected officials have been working towards providing all residents with curbside trash and recycling service at a lower cost. In August 2009, Benner Township joined College, Harris, Ferguson and Patton Townships in a contract with Veolia Environmental Services for the 2010 – 2012 collection of refuse and recycling. The Centre Region COG, acting as an agent for the townships, awarded the bid to Veolia after a competitive bidding process that ensures that the monthly collection rate for refuse and recycling stay low. Monthly rates beginning January 1, 2010, will be **\$15.10 for unlimited refuse and recycling collection**. There is also a low usage rate of \$12.05 per month that allows for one 40 pound bag or canister to be disposed of per week.

Beginning January 1, 2010, all residential properties in Benner Township will be required to participate in this program. Working farms greater than 10 acres, multi-family dwellings of 5 or more units, commercial properties, and institutions are <u>not</u> required to participate in curbside collection.

Services associated with the Regional Refuse and Recycling Program include:

- *Weekly refuse and recycling collection
- *Semi-annual bulk waste collection at the curb
- *Curbside Christmas tree collection (January 11th—15th curbside)
- *Hardship program for eligible customers

Residents will be receiving a brochure further describing the services in early December along with an invoice for the 1st quarter of 2010. If you are new to recycling, you should receive a new bin by the end of December. If you don't, please call Veolia at 237-3713.

Guide to Recycling

Keep this handy guide near your recycling bin or on the refrigerator.

Mixed Office Paper, Junk Mail, Paperboard, Magazines & Catalogs

Curbside customers should tie with string or place in paper or plastic bags. Cereal boxes, six-pack holders, etc. go here.



- -No hardback books (unless covers are removed)
- -No blueprints
- No plastic bags in drop-off bins or commercial carts
- -Recycle plastic bags at the market

Newspapers, Inserts & Phone Books

Curbside customer should tie with string or place in paper or plastic bags. Keep dry.



- -Newspaper inserts may remain
- -No wet or yellowed newspaper
- -No plastic bags in drop-off bins or commercial carts
- -Recycle plastic bags at the market
- -Do not mix paperboard with news

Plastic Bottles, Jugs & Jars

We accept narrow neck plastic bottles, jugs and jars only. Please rinse and remove lids.



- -No tubs or trays
- -No margarine or yogurt containers
- -No buckets
- -No plastic cups
- -Prescription bottles accepted

Aerosol, Steel & Aluminum Cans/ Aluminum Foil

Non-aerosol cans may be smashed to save space. No Need to remove labels. Please rinse out food and drink. We accept **empty** aerosol and paint cans.





- -No bulky scrap metal (scrap metal may be dropped off at the Transfer Station free of charge)
- -No liquid paint left in paint cans

Glass Bottles & Jars

Clear, green and brown bottles and jars. Please rinse and removed lids. Blue glass may be placed with green.



-No light bulbs

- -No window glass
- -No ceramic containers
- -No drinking glasses

Corrugated Cardboard

Dry, corrugated cardboard only.

Flatten boxes.



- -Corrugated cardboard only
- -No paperboard (place with mixed paper)
- -No waxed, oily or wet cardboard
- -No plastic inserts or packaging peanuts

Fire Services Update

The Supervisors have been meeting regularly with other elected officials from Spring, Marion, Walker and Bellefonte on a fair contribution to Bellefonte Borough for fire protection expenses but have not been able to come to a basic understanding with the them on this or other regional concerns. In light of the impasse and the possibility that other fire protection arrangements may need to be implemented, we are asking Benner Township citizens who are trained firemen and those who would be willing to serve to contact the Township office (355-1419). We are investigating the establishment of a satellite station within the Township limits that will be associated with an existing fire company. It is the hope of the Supervisors that a regional approach to fire protection will eventually prevail, and we will continue to strive towards that end.
