MINUTES

The minutes of February 2, 2015, were presented to the Board for their review and comments. Mr. Moyer moved to approve the minutes as presented. Mr. Wise seconded the motion.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

Mrs. Royer reported on Mr. Franson's behalf that the requests for proposals for the Phase 1 study pertaining to the trail project will be ready for consideration at the Board's next meeting.

ROAD SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. O'Leary reported on the following:

- *Still snow plowing as needed.
- *Getting prices on the equipment additions and repairs that were included in the budget which include: *a new bed for the pick-up truck
 - *a new bed for the older Ford dump truck
 - *a planer for the skid steer
 - *a new tow behind equipment trailer
- *Road projects for the year will include some pipe replacement, paving of a section of Purdue Mt. Road and tar & chipping. Mr. O'Leary noted that he is stilling looking into the possibility of applying for dirt and gravel road money for drainage work.

ZONING OFFICER'S REPORT

Mrs. Schoch reported on the following:

- *The Planning Commission met two times last month
- *The Benner Commerce Park is going to conduct a new traffic study to determine if a traffic light still needs to remain in their surety package for the development.
- *The trail project has been placed on hold until the Phase 1 study is completed.
- *The ZHB granted variances for both the Hartman Agency and the Centre County Airport Authority.
- *The Village of Nittany Glen will be attending the Planning Commission's March meeting to discuss the proposed zoning amendment being proposed.

- *The Planning Commission has been reviewing the zoning ordinance amendment for the Ag Tourism definition. It was noted that Mr. Marchek has made some recommendations, some of which the Planning Commission didn't agree with.
- *The Planning Commission also worked on the Economic Development Survey that was requested by the Nittany Valley Joint Planning Commission
- *Investigated complaints by the neighbors of Tom Songer along Spring Creek regarding the new home that he is building and whether or not he is in violation of the Zoning Hearing Board's decision by elevating the topography of his lot.
- *A copy of the Planning Commission's Annual Report was given to the Board as required by the Municipal Planning Code.
- *Mrs. Schoch noted that she has been in contact with Chuck Herr at the beginning of last month regarding the proposed zoning ordinance that he is putting together and he informed her that it would be given to her only after the document is completed. She noted that she received her copy today and has started going through it. She noted that she hopes that his draft is consistent with the Township's Comprehensive Plan. Copies have also been made and distributed to the Planning Commission.

Mr. Campbell noted that the Planning Commission was very surprised to learn that Chuck Herr was working on a new zoning ordinance and questioned when this work was authorized as he reviewed the Supervisors' minutes and found no mention of it being discussed. He further questioned why the Planning Commission was kept in the dark about this. Mr. Campbell stated further that the Planning Commission has worked diligently on amending the Zoning Ordinance over the past year and doesn't understand why this new direction has been taken.

Mr. Moyer noted that the revisions were being piecemealed before and that a lot of time was being invested with little results. He stated that he feels that the Planning Commission now has something solid to look at and work on. Mr. Moyer noted further that the Planning Commission had proposed removing 180 pages from the Roth Plan but that with those revisions nothing with the actual zoning changed and that it was going nowhere. He encouraged the Planning Commission take Mr. Herr's version and review it.

Mr. Wise noted that he personally believes that even with this draft, that adopting a new zoning ordinance is a long time away. Noting further that careful consideration will need to be made to insure that the document remains consistent with the Nittany Valley Regional Comprehensive Plan.

Mr. Campbell questioned how Mr. Herr came up with this document, zoning districts, etc. as the normal process of creating such a document involves meetings and feedback from the Planning Commission which obviously hasn't happened.

Mr. Moyer noted that the document has been created after Mr. Herr reviewed the Township's previous and current zoning ordinances.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Mr. Wise reported that he attended the MPO meeting this past month. Noting that nothing of great substance took place at the meeting.

OLD BUSINESS
